The Arkansas Archeological Society is an organization for people of all ages and occupations who are interested in prehistoric and historic archeology in Arkansas. Active local chapters across the state hold monthly meetings offering speakers, news of current events, and opportunities to help with research and preservation projects. The Training Program in Archeology

The Training Program gives interested members of the Arkansas Archeological Society the chance to get involved in all phases of archeological fieldwork: survey, mapping, excavation, photography, laboratory, and more.

The program takes place each year in June, offering varied experiences at both prehistoric and historic sites throughout the state. The work contributes to scientific research projects that add new information to our knowledge about the archeology of Arkansas.



Requirements

- Participants must be members of the Arkansas Archeological Society with dues paid in full for all family members at the site.
- All participants must attend an orientation before beginning the training.
- Children 17 years and younger must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times.
- Minimum age is 8 years old.
- Participants must abide by all rules established by the sponsoring organizations and the Camp Boss.
- Registration fees vary, based on location and length of stay for each participant.
- All artifacts and other objects, notes, and other information resulting from the fieldwork are curated by the Arkansas Archeological Survey for the benefit of all the people of Arkansas.



Features

- Archeological field experience at real sites as part of ongoing research programs.
- You may register for any number of days during the two-week session, but you must complete the Beginners' Orientation before beginning work.
- On-site camping or blocks of rooms in nearby motels; accommodations and fees vary depending on available local facilities.
- Field and lab training provided by the professional archeologists of the Arkansas Archeological Survey.
- Beginning and advanced seminars on various topics with classroom and hands-on instruction.
- Optional evening lectures on varied subjects.
